Student Learning Outcomes and Enabling Objectives

- 1. Produce various communications that respond appropriately to a variety of rhetorical situations (audiences, purposes, and contexts) relevant to both their academic courses and the workplace.
 - a. Communicate research across different situations considering purpose, audience, and context.
 - b. Apply appropriate genre conventions to a variety of discipline-specific and professional written communications.
 - c. Adapt communication styles for a variety of technologies and modes
 - d. Investigate effective and ineffective communication strategies.
- 2. Use critical and creative thinking, inquiry and analysis, reflection, synthesis, and transfer of learning within and across disciplines and professions.
 - a. Apply critical thinking, specifically multiple perspectives and elements of argument, to the analysis and interpretation of texts, such as evaluating claims and supporting reasons.
 - b. Gather evidence and documentation to demonstrate competency.

 - d. Devise analysis methods for a situation that leads to a solution.
 - e. Analyze situations and demonstrate logical thinking as in mathematical reasoning, scientific inquiry, or a step-by-step process.

- 7. How do I determine the appropriate, credible information and data from a variety of research to effectively address an issue or problem?
- 8. How do my oral and written communication skills influence my ability to successfully convey complex thoughts and ideas?
- 9. How will the skills I am learning in college, support the transition to a successful career?
