Student Learning Outcomes & Enabling Objectives

By the end of the course, students will demonstrate the ability to:

- 1. Develop proficiency in presenting a variety of speeches as an individual and as a group.
 - a. Demonstrate foundational models of oral communication.
 - b. Create coherent speech outlines and speeches that demonstrate their ability to use organizational formats with clear and specific purpose.
 - c. Apply elements of audience analysis and adaptation.
 - d. Demonstrate ethical speaking and listening skills.
 - e. Analyze presentations for evidence, logic, and persuasive appeals.
 - f. Utilize appropriate use of language, nonverbal delivery, and visual information/technology based on purpose and audience.
 - g. Create extemporaneous speeches with effective verbal and nonverbal techniques.
- 2. Create messages demonstrating effective information gathering, analysis, and evaluation.
 - a. Incorporate credible sources, reliable research, sound reasoning, and evidence that supports claims.
 - b. Demonstrate effective usage of technology when researching and/or presenting speeches.
 - c. Apply electronic and non-electronic presentational aids, appropriate for the audience and occasion.
- 3. Adapt presentations to an audience based on situational, demographics, and psychological audience analysis.
 - a. Identify how culture, ethnicity, and gender influence communication.
 - b. Assess the diversity of an audience.
 - c. Use pronunciation, grammar, and articulation appropriate to the audience and occasion.
- 4. Compose clear communications, both written and oral, that respond appropriately to a variety of rhetorical situations (audiences, purposes, and contexts).
 - a. Demonstrate a clear and consistent purpose with evidence and detail.

- b. Respond to the needs of different rhetorical situations.
- c. Employ a tone consistent with rhetorical situations.
- d. Recognize the utility of digital technologies for composition.
- e. Use structural conventions such as organization, formatting, and paragraphing.
- f. Use syntax, grammar, punctuation, and spelling appropriate to the situation.
- g. Recognize evolving conventions of multimodal composition.
