 - a. Describe the origins of emerging forms of violence, including hate crimes, school violence, and U.S. terrorism.
 - b. Explain how technology, human trafficking and legal and illegal drugs have changed the landscape of criminal justice.
 - c. Explain "mala in se" and "malum prohibitum" as they relate to crime classification.
 - d. Describe how crime data is collected in the U.S. and its effectiveness in providing solutions to stopping recidivism.
- 4. Explain the meaning of deviant behavior, crime and its impact on the nation, communities and individuals.
 - a. Discuss the differences between juvenile and adult offending.
 - b. Explain how individual personality traits increase or reduce the likelihood of criminal behavior.
- 5. Discuss the ways to interrupt the progression to prison.

- a. Explain how marginalized communities are impacted more severely by our current criminal justice system.
- b. Discuss the "age crime curve" and which interventions promote "desistance" and reduce recidivism.
- c. Discuss the concepts of 'broken windows' theory, social equality, and restorative justice.
