Student Learning Outcomes and Enabling Objectives

- 1. Demonstrate proficiency in factual and accurate report writing, and written communication.
 - a. Produce well-structured, factual, and accurate written reports in the context of criminal justice scenarios.
 - b. Demonstrate the use of proper criminal justice terminology in report writing.
- 2. Apply effective oral communication tools and skills for de-escalation and conflict management in criminal justice contexts and scenarios.
 - a. Discuss active listening and persuasive communication skills when interacting with individuals involved in criminal justice processes, including the mentally ill, those with challenges and neurodiversity.
 - Explain how to communicate clearly and respectfully when interacting with a diverse public, including individuals from different cultural, linguistic, and socioeconomic backgrounds.
 - c. Discuss communication barriers related to diversity and inclusivity in criminal justice interactions.
 - d. Describe the demeanor and intentions of individuals in criminal justice scenarios by interpreting body language, micro and macro-facial expressions, non-verbal cues and gestures.
- 3. Demonstrate professional presentation skills.
 - a. Present oneself in a professional and authoritative manner when doing a presentation and when answering questions during a mock interview.
 - b. Explain appropriate attire, demeanor, and etiquette in virtual and in-person criminal justice settings.
- 4. Create effective self-marketing tools for various job opportunities in the criminal justice field.

- a. Complete polished and tailored résumés and cover letters that highlight relevant skills, experiences, and qualifications for entry-level positions in the criminal justice field.
- b. Use industry-specific terminology in the preparation of job application materials and written communication.
- 5. Explain the ethical and legal implications surrounding the sharing of confidential information in criminal justice.
 - a. Discuss the personal and professional responsibilities regarding ethical conduct and compliance with specific standards in criminal justice occupations.
 - b. Explore the effects that the digital age has on retaining confidentiality and personal privacy while fighting crime.
