DHY2050 Clinical Dental Hygeine V

Student Learning Outcomes

Each student will complete the following with at least 77% accuracy:

- Differentiate between the following types of special needs patients: patients with a
 disability, homebound patients, those with physical impairment, seizure disorder,
 sensory impairment, blood disorder, developmental/behavioral/psychiatric disorders,
 and substance abuse.
- 2. Apply appropriate preventive care programs with the special patient.
- 3. Evaluate psychological implications of oral care given to the special needs patient.
- 4. Distinguish between modifications in treatment for each of the special needs patients.
- 5. Design a treatment plan for the dental hygiene needs of a special needs patient to include medical/dental history concerns, appointment planning, instrumentation and preventive instruction specific to the situation.
- 6. Model the clinical skills learned in previous clinical courses.
- 7. Model professional behavior and etiquette throughout patient treatment.
- 8. Evaluate a professional journal article relating to the "special needs" patients discussed in the course, utilizing the library, Internet and other valuable resources.
- 9. Assess the value and uses of case documentation in relation to record keeping.
- 10. Plan and present a written case documentation based on the current criteria.
- 11. Analyze how intraoral photography can be used in dentistry.
- 12. Identify the advantages and disadvantages of available camera systems utilized in dentistry.
- 13. Compose a picture that is centered as well as free of extraneous objects.
- 14. Assess the proper use of photographic equipment.
- 15. Identify current continuing education requirements for Michigan licensure.
- 16. Analyze goals and objectives of the American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA).
- 17. Appraise the availability of patient education material for a dental hygiene professional.
- 18. Assess the current dental insurance structure utilized in Michigan.
- 19. Classify the dental insurance coding system as it relates to dental treatment.
- 20. Compare the ADHA and ADA Code of Ethics.

- 21. Debate how discrimination and sexual harassment may impact the profession of dental hygiene.
- 22. Identify signs and symptoms of child, elder and domestic abuse.
- 23. Interpret the dental hygienists' legal responsibilities in terms of child abuse.
- 24. Compare and contrast the advantages and disadvantages of alternative employment settings.
- 25. Summarize the additional requirements, training, or education needed to work in alternative settings.
- 26. Identify why dental hygiene researchers and educators are necessary.
- 27. Propose an entrepreneurial initiative to be used within the practice of dental hygiene.
- 28. Predict means of managing and marketing this entrepreneurial initiative to professional peers.
- 29. Differentiate between an independent contractor and self-employment.
- 30. Take part in one or more various teamwork activities relating to professional development, ethical conduct, legal issues, child or elder abuse, or any other topics.
- 31. Practice teamwork activities related to patient assessment, sterilization procedures and appointment control.
- 32. Apply professional behavior and etiquette throughout patient treatment.
- 33. Demonstrate the use of nitrous oxide sedation, including the technique of administration, patient preparation, monitoring and potential post-operative issues.
- 34. List considerations of the treatment room including barrier free environment, patient transfer, and appointment scheduling.
- 35. Define forensic dentistry and identify the role a dental hygienist may play in this field.
- 36. Define myofunctional therapy and the training available to provide it.
- 37. Evaluate holistic dentistry and its effect on common dental procedures.
- 38. Demonstrate the ability to expose diagnostic radiographs.
- 39. Demonstrate the "knee to knee" with an infant or toddler.
