- 6. Define nonsurgical periodontal therapy.
 - a. Appraise the goals and rationale for periodontal treatment planning.
- 7. Relate the importance of patient compliance with supportive periodontal treatment and the strategies to improve compliance with recommended maintenance intervals and oral hygiene regiments.
 - a. Formulate a customized home care regimen for a periodontal patient.
 - b. Question home care aids for their usefulness in individual cases
- 8. Describe the benefits of oral irrigation for the patient with periodontal disease.
 - a. Compare and contrast the agents that can be used in irrigation.
- 9. Describe how the use of the local delivery agents may affect the infection within a periodontal pocket
 - a. Assess which antibiotics can be used for systemic or local administration in the treatment of periodontal diseases.
- 10. Define the term Host Modulation therapy in dentistry.
 - a. List three drugs that may be utilized for possible modulating agents.
- 11. Compare and contrast the advantages and disadvantages of periodontal surgery.
 - a. Assess the procedures for regeneration of the periodontium (guided tissue regeneration).
 - b. Evaluate the wound repair process as it relates to periodontal surgery.
- 12. Assess the role of the dental hygienist in the recognition and treatment of periodontal emergencies.
 - a. Compare and contrast the signs, symptoms, and treatment considerations in patients with gingival, periodontal, and periapical abscesses.
- 13. Recognize the role of the dental hygienist in Motivational interviewing

- a. Identify the key elements of the Motivational Interviewing philosophy.
- 14. Explain the determinants of a successful maintenance appointment.
 - a. Predict the process of healing after periodontal debridement procedures, scaling, root planing, and gingival curettage.
- 15. Assess the criteria for determining success with implant placement.
 - a. Analyze the types of implants.
 - b. Define osseointegration.
- 16. Describe the immunopathology of periodontal disease.
 - a. Predict modifications needed to best treat patients with systemic conditions.
- 17. Relate the role of the dental hygienist in diagnosis of malodor.
 - a. Recognize systemic factors that influence xerostomia.
- 18. Explain the importance of accurate record keeping, in terms of periodontal notations.
 - a. Define the term liability, negligence, and malpractice.
- 19. Review the diagnostic technologies for patients with periodontal diseases.
 - a. Differentiate systemic conditions that have a connection to periodontitis.
