Student Learning Outcomes and Enabling Objectives

- 1. Assess a client's health within a therapeutic nurse-client relationship assuring patient privacy, confidentiality, and safety.
 - a. Use interviewing, observation, and physical examination to complete a health assessment
 - Assess physical health using a systematic approach focusing on anatomical, physiological, psychosocial, nutritional, developmental norms and theories, cultural, and environmental factors
 - c. Document health assessment findings effectively in verbal, written, and electronic forms.
 - d. Evaluate data from all relevant sources, including technology, in the delivery of health care.
- 2. Interpret health assessment data.
 - a. Differentiate normal findings from abnormal findings taking into account a client's age, developmental stage, and cultural background. (Essential IV # 6, Essential VII # 1)
 - b. Collaborate with other members of the inter professional team on providing a plan of care for the patient
- 3. Recommend interventions, based on patient assessment, appropriate to promoting the quality of life across the lifespan.
 - a. Based on a clinical assessment of a client's health, apply principles of learning and teaching to health promotion/education activities.
