  - c. Determine appropriate evidence-based strategies to provide comprehensive and holistic care to patients with mental illness.
  - d. Apply caring techniques that are culturally sensitive to promote the holistic wellbeing of patients with mental illness.
  - e. Illustrate appropriate use of assessment tools.
- 4. Demonstrate professional behaviors in collaboration with the interdisciplinary team members to meet the needs of patients with mental illness.
  - a. Compare and contrast the roles and responsibilities of Interdisciplinary Team (IDT) members in the mental health setting

- b. Communicate relevant information to the appropriate IDT member in the care of patients with mental illness
- c. Examine one's own beliefs and values as they relate to mental illness.
- d. Examine the impact of attitudes, values, and expectations on the care of patients with mental illness.
- e. Employ principles of quality improvement to assist in the identification of systemwide practices that will improve the quality of healthcare delivery in the mental health setting.
