Student Learning Outcomes & Enabling Objectives

- 1. Create an evidence-based plan using improvement methods to effectively implement patient safety and continuous quality improvement
 - a. Apply effective leadership and management principles within the interdisciplinary team
 - b. Apply concepts of quality and safety using process and outcome measures and creative strategies to describe the process of changing current practice(s)
 - c. Participate in quality and patient safety initiatives, which can involve individuals, families, groups, communities, populations, and other members of the healthcare team
 - d. Communicate effectively with all members of the healthcare team, including the patient and the patient's support network
 - e. Explain safeguard and decision-making tools embedded in patient care technologies and information systems to support a safe practice environment for both the patient and healthcare workers
- 2. Apply professional and ethical behaviors to provide leadership in promoting advocacy, collaboration, and social justice in the nursing profession
 - a. Discuss the importance of being a socially responsible citizen
 - b. Reflect on one's own beliefs and values as they relate to professional practice
 - c. Explore the need for professional boundaries with patients, families, and other caregivers
 - d. Differentiate between the ethical principles of autonomy, beneficence, nonmaleficence, and distributive justice as it applies to treatment decisions for patients
- 3. Evaluate the legal issues in nursing related to professional licensure, patient care rights, management issues, and employment issues.
 - a. Reflect on the implications of state control of nursing licensure as well as possible remedies
 - b. Explore patient care rights to privacy, confidentiality, informed consent, right to refuse treatment, and freedom from restraint
 - c. Analyze management roles in delegation and supervision, staffing, job reassignment, release of information, and incompetent practice
 - d. Explore employment issues related to the Civil Rights Act, sexual harassment, age discrimination, American with Disabilities Act, Family and Medical Leave Act, and Occupational Safety and Health Act.
 - 4. Explore the future of healthcare in terms of technological innovations,

healthcare legislation, and demands for consumerism.

- a. Discuss the Institute of Medicine recommendations for the future of nursing
- b. Examine the role mobile devices will play in caring for patients across the globe
- c. Explore the impact of changes to or elimination of the Affordable Care Act could have on patients and healthcare systems.
- d. Explain the role consumerism will play in creating products and services that are not only easily assessible but also personalized.
- 5. Examine inter-professional and intra-professional resources to resolve ethical, legal, or other nursing practice dilemmas
 - a. Discuss with a healthcare team one's personal bias on difficult healthcare issues that impact one's ability to provide care
 - b. Apply effective communication techniques such as conflict resolution and negotiation to produce positive outcomes
