## **Student Learning Outcomes & Enabling Objectives**

- 1. Articulate an understanding of the OT process.
  - a. Discuss psychosocial deficits, family and support services, culture, and values.
- 2. Consider factors that might bias assessment results such as culture, disability status, and situational variables related to the individual and context.
- Compare and contrast the role of the occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistant.
  - a. Identify the role in the screening and evaluation process, supervision.
  - b. Describe the collaborative relationship.
- 4. Use sound judgment in regard to safety of self and others and adhere to safety regulations throughout the occupational therapy process as appropriate to the setting and scope of practice.
- 5. Use and interpret standardized and non-standardized screening and assessment tools.
  - a. Determine the need for occupational therapy intervention in relation to accepted terminology of the profession.
  - b. Discuss relevant theoretical frameworks. These include skilled observations, interviews, and consultations with other professionals.
- 6. Use appropriate procedures and protocols when administering assessments and skilled interventions.
- 7. Use clinical reasoning to explain the rationale for and use of compensatory strategies when desired life tasks cannot be performed.
- 8. Formulate an intervention plan.
  - a. Demonstrate task analysis in areas of occupation, performance skills, performance patterns, and activity demands, context, environments, and client factors.

- 9. Use scholarly literature to make evidence-based decisions regarding developing intervention strategies and implementation.
- 10. Analyze, synthesize, and apply models of occupational performance and theories that underlie the practice of occupational therapy.
  - a. Develop and/or conduct a treatment plan or session for the following:
    - Dysphagia
    - Functional mobility and transfers (bed, wheelchair, commode)
    - Biomechanical strategies & techniques
    - Cognitive retraining
    - Visual and/or visual perceptual strategies & techniques
    - Sensorimotor strategies & techniques
    - Compensatory strategies &techniques
    - Family and caregiver education
      - It must incorporate the analysis of data gathered during the evaluation process in collaboration with the client and others.
- 11. Demonstrate the ability to document occupational therapy services to ensure accountability of service provision and meet standards for reimbursement, legislative requirements.
  - a. Communicate the need and rationale for occupational therapy services.
