 - a. Examine Evaluation phase responsibilities:
 - i. Explain the role of the OT/OTA in the evaluation and referral process.
 - ii. Administer assessments.
 - iii. Gather data.
 - iv. Complete an occupational profile.
 - b. Examine Intervention phase responsibilities:
 - i. Demonstrate safety of self and others.
 - ii. Plan a treatment session using clinical reasoning.
 - iii. Implement treatment to address client goals.
 - iv. Use activity analysis to grade, adapt, and/or modify an intervention.
 - v. Demonstrate professional behaviors.
 - vi. Recommend adaptive equipment.
 - vii. Provide patient education.
 - c. Examine Outcomes phase responsibilities:
 - i. Document an intervention.
 - ii. Communicate effectively with inter- and intra-professionals all intervention outcomes.
 - iii. Plan discharge and next level of care recommendations.

- 3. Conduct an occupational therapy intervention.
 - a. Demonstrate prepatory activities, including range of motion (ROM).
 - b. Demonstrate purposeful activities, including functional mobility.
 - c. Perform an occupation-based intervention.
- 4. Analyze the role of scientific evidence in occupational therapy and evidence-based practice (EBP).
 - a. Discuss different types of research and scholarship.
 - b. Perform scholarly activities to promote EBP.
 - c. Differentiate between standard OTA practice to EBP.
