OTA2310 Clinical Techniques in Physical Dysfunction 3 Semester Credit Hours

Student Learning Outcomes and Enabling Objectives

- 1. Analyze the Occupational Therapist Assistant's scope of practice in the realm of physical dysfunction.
 - a. Demonstrate ethical OT treatment planning.
 - b. Apply the concepts in the OT Domains into treatment planning and assessment.
 - c. Demonstrate appropriate role delineation and OTA scope of practice during treatment planning.
- 2. Analyze the role and responsibilities of the Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) in each phase of the OT Process.
 - a. Examine Evaluation phase responsibilities:
 - Identify Performance Skills that need OT intervention planning from an occupational profile.
 - Gather data regarding precautions and contraindications prior to treatment.
 - b. Examine Intervention phase responsibilities:
 - Demonstrate safety of self and others.
 - Plan a treatment session using clinical reasoning.
 - Implement treatment to address client goals.
 - Use activity analysis to grade, adapt, and/or modify an intervention.
 - Demonstrate professional behaviors.
 - Recommend adaptive equipment.
 - Provide patient education.
 - c. Examine Outcomes phase responsibilities:
 - Document an intervention.
 - Communicate effectively with inter- and intra-professionals all intervention outcomes.
 - Plan discharge and next level of care recommendations.

- 3. Conduct an occupational therapy intervention.
 - a. Demonstrate preparatory activities, including physical agent modalities (PAMs) and splinting/orthotics.
 - Perform a competency with hot/cold packs.
 - Provide education on an HEP
 - b. Demonstrate purposeful activities, including application of orthotics, adaptive equipment, and modified techniques into daily self-care tasks.
 - Fabricate a splint.
 - Perform a competency with lower body dressing post-total hip arthroplasty using adaptive equipment to maintain safety with surgical precautions.
 - Demonstrate safe TLSO and/or back brace application.
 - Perform a competency with upper body dressing post-rotator cuff repair using modified techniques, slings, and/or equipment.
 - c. Perform an occupation-based intervention that includes elements of prepatory and purposeful activities.
 - d. Demonstrate Evidence Based Practice.

- Physical Agent Modalities (PAMs)
- Slings, Braces, Splints, and other orthotics
- Common surgical protocols and precautions
- Specialty and Nontraditional Practice Settings

- 1. How are physical agent modalities included in OT intervention?
- 2. What is the OTA's role with splints and orthotics?
- 3. What will be emerging areas of practice for OT clinicians?
- 4. What is the impact of evidence-based practice upon common surgical and health conditions?
