OTA 2410 Elements of Therapeutic Media 3 Semester Credit Hours

Student Learning Outcomes and Enabling Objectives

- 1. Summarize the history of the use of media as a mode of intervention.
 - a. Describe the trend of using craft in occupational therapy since the founding of the profession.
 - b. Describe the historical context of activity analysis in occupational therapy.
 - c. Evaluate the impact of technology on therapeutic media used in intervention.
 - d. Articulate the value of therapeutic media as an intervention for wellness and disability.
- 2. Evaluate client factors required to safely utilize therapeutic media using activity analysis.
 - a. Apply knowledge of neurology and motor skills to identify physical requirements needed to complete activities using therapeutic media.
 - b. Discuss global and specific mental functions required to successfully work with selected media.
 - c. Assess safety measures and precautions for clients with diminished sensory and cognitive abilities.
 - d. Apply activity analysis in context of the Occupational Therapy Process.
- 3. Create meaningful and purposeful occupational intervention by combining knowledge of culture, environment (social and physical), and context.
 - a. Distinguish between client performance patterns and personal characteristics that affect activity selection.
 - b. Choose appropriate models of practice consistent with the client's culture, environment, and context.
 - c. Interpret temporal aspects that potentially impact selection of activities used in intervention.
 - d. Discuss the impact on environment on activity characteristics.
 - e. Develop a client-centered intervention consistent with cultural, social, and personal background.
- 4. Execute group interventions using therapeutic media.
 - a. Identify relevant media and goals for use in directing a group of individuals who have cognitive impairment, mental health challenges, and physical impairment.

- b. Gather basic supplies needed to complete a chosen activity consistent with diagnoses.
- c. Teach steps to safely complete an activity.
- d. Describe how documentation of therapeutic media is consistent with the general purposes of documentation.
