## PSY3010 Forensic Psychology 3 Semester Credit Hours

### **Student Learning Outcomes and Enabling Objectives**

- 1. Explore the history and development of forensic psychology.
  - a. Examine key figures related to forensic psychology.
- 2. Analyze the origins of criminal behavior.
  - a. Explore key theories and research related to forensic psychology.
  - b. Identify different types of criminal behavior.
  - c. Explore the biopsychosocial factors related to forensic psychology.
  - d. Analyze the sociocultural factors related to criminal behavior.
- 3. Explore ethical issues and cultural concerns associated with forensic psychology.
  - a. Examine ethical requirements for forensic psychology including duty to warn and mandated reporters.
  - b. Discuss ethical challenges in the field of forensic psychology including confidentiality and suspected abuse/neglect/maltreatment.
  - c. Explore cultural concerns associated with forensic psychology, the criminal justice system, and the familial legal system.
- 4. Explore the different forensic psychology specialties and career paths.
  - a. Explore primary job duties and educational/licensure requirements for different careers and professionals related to forensic psychology.
  - b. Explore the impact of working in the forensic psychology field on the professional.
  - c. Examine jury consultation and characteristics.
  - d. Examine court ordered evaluations, including:
    - i. competency to stand trial
    - ii. insanity or mental health defense
    - iii. child custody evaluations
    - iv. maltreatment evaluations
  - e. Explore eyewitness testimony, profiling, and confessions.
  - f. Explore different types of criminal investigations.
  - g. Explore characteristics relevant to victimization/victimology.

- 5. Contrast rehabilitation and punishment.
  - a. Explore the impact of long-term incarceration on perpetrators, victims, and families.
  - b. Examine recidivism relative to rehabilitation.
  - c. Examine sociocultural factors with rehabilitation and punishment.
