Use these as guides as you speak with roommates as well. We encourage you to go beyond what you see on a Facebook profile. As foreign as it may seem, the Residence Life staff wants you to pick up the phone and *talk* to your new roommates as you get to know them.

Social Habits: Noise Level, TV and Computer Usage

Study Habits: Time of Day, Noise Level, Location, Guests Allowed

Use of Personal Property: Stereo, Television, Other Technology, Clothing, Toiletries

<u>Visitation:</u> Overnight Guests, Overnight Guest Gender, Room Visitation Hours, Guests' Behavior, Where Do Guests Sleep

Sleeping Environment: Noise, Windows Open/Closed, TV ON/OFF, "Snooze" Button Use

Community Purchases: Furniture, Housewares, Cleaning Supplies, Food/Drink

Personal Hygiene: Bed Linens, Laundry, Shower Time, Scheduled Bathroom Time

Cleanliness of Unit: Picking Up Personal Items, Taking Off Shoes, Cleaning Schedule
